DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements of Edinburgh Technology Transfer Centre Limited ("the Company") for the year ended 31 July 2014.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Company's principal activities are the provision of early-stage incubation support to high-growth start-up and spin-out companies with on-going research and development links to the University of Edinburgh, and the provision of lettable project-office and laboratory facilities to these companies during the early stages of their development.

The Company is limited by guarantee of the University of Edinburgh and the City of Edinburgh Council and accordingly has no share capital.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

A steady improvement in economic conditions has led to more stable climate for ETTC despite the early-stage investment market remaining tight. Demand at both facilities remains relatively high underpinning good trading performance. That good trading performance provided resources to upgrade meeting room facilities at the Alrick Building. Efforts to improve access to early stage capital will continue and will hopefully deliver a positive impact amongst tenant companies during the next period. However, the decanting of the Appleton Tower facility to the nearby Wilkie Building will result in some business interruption, extra costs and lost revenue towards the end of the next period.

The profit for the year after taxation amounted to £22,957 (2013: £24,877).

The directors recommend that the sum of £22,957 be transferred to reserves. (2013 transfer to reserves: £24,877).

The directors will continue to promote the Company's objectives and look for appropriate opportunities in the forthcoming year.

DIRECTORS

The directors of the company who were in office during the year and up to the date of signing of the financial statements are detailed on page 2. None of the directors who held office at the end of the financial year has any disclosable interest in the shares of the Company.



STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RESPECT OF THE DIRECTORS' REPORT AND THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Report on the financial statements

Our opinion

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

at 31 July 2014

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently throughout the year are set out below.

Under Financial Reporting Standard 1 the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements.

Fundamental accounting concept

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on a straight-line basis, at rates calculated to write off the cost, less any estimated residual value, of each asset on a straight-line basis over its expected useful life, as follows:

Office equipment - 25% per annum

Items of a minor nature are written off to revenue in the year of purchase.

Revenue Grants

Revenue grants received are written off to profit and loss in the year in which they are received.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit or loss for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

2. TURNOVER

Turnover represents rental income receivable and expenses recharged (excluding Value Added Tax) and arises wholly from the principal activities of the Company within the United Kingdom.
